Come join parents and teachers in this interactive workshop and training with the California Conference for Equality and Justice. Explore identity terms and current examples of challenging topics. Learn strategies to better listen and speak with your child as they make sense of identity, conflict, and the world.

With the current rise in national media coverage of issues connected to identity, such as race and gender identity, many children are struggling to understand what is happening around them, and how it impacts them and their families. This training will provide parents and families with an overview of key terms related to identity and human relations to help them better understand rapidly changing identities and communities.

The training will also explore some pressing human relations issues facing students in schools, and will include a hands-on practice session for parents and families to use listening and reflective question asking skills with their children.
